Letters and Information from the Card Lady Bee – Sue Johnston

These letters were sent to Ev Campbell who then gave them to Sue.

Subject: All-time record mailing - end of April through mid-June

Let me start with some stories about where our 55 boxes went.

One man who requested items on behalf of his team is a medic. His name appears to be Polish, Russian, or similar heritage. He included a picture on the website. He is so tall that all the guys around him came to or below the nametag on his shirt, which is above the pocket.

One group is in an undisclosed location, where they are not allowed to leave the site to shop off the economy and there is no store for them on the site. They are restricted to 2 minute showers and do their laundry in buckets. A recent hurricane and sandstorms nearly wiped out what there was on the site.

A female troop said they had a fun time on Memorial Day, in recognition of fallen soldiers who came before them. They ran one mile, did 100 pull-ups, 200 push-ups, 300 squats, then ran another mile. Everyone finished. Temperature was over 100. When she wrote this on June 8th it was 120.

I was able to pack so many more boxes than usual because I had a lot more money for postage this time because of the generosity of neighbors who gave me items to consign. I receive 70 cents of each dollar of the price tag. I consigned and sold: a china cabinet, patio table and 6 chairs, small recliner, large wicker chair, 2 bar stools!!!!! Many small items were also donated, so I had checks for \$400 in April and \$100 in May. I average \$100 each month.

The Rosary Makers at St. Joseph's Catholic Church in Tucson don't meet during the summer. At their last meeting they decided to enclose a check for \$100 with the rosaries they made for the troops! At the time that I opened the check, I had just made a list of items the troops needed. I was able to buy 95 items at our great 99 cent store!!!

Other donations of considerable amounts included one for \$300 and one for \$50. Other money came from the jar at Biscuits Cafe, and the sale of the fancy cards a lady gave us to sell.

The man who bought so many packages of peanuts weekly at the Vail Quik Mart doesn't do it anymore, but there were still lots of great items donated to the box there.

As always, thank you to all the card makers, and Eileen, who helped me pack some boxes.

Here's what our creativity produced:

- 13 Father's Day posters for the troops themselves
- 61 Fourth of July cards for veterans at TMC Hospice
- 75 Fourth of July cards for troops to hang (20 were new)
- 28 Fourth of July posters for the troops

All occasion cards to mail and birthday and promotion cards for the troops themselves:

- 3,902 (3,214 all occasion and 429 support)
- 3,643 we made

Dear Ev,

First and foremost thank you all so much for all the care packages you sent us! We have been deployed for roughly two and half months now. We have mostly been aboard the USS Boxer alongside with the Navy. We we're able to briefly get off the ship for training in Hawaii and in South Korea as well. It was a pretty crazy difference going from the hot and humid Hawaii weather to the freezing temperature in South Korea. We also made a quick stop in Hong Kong for a couple days of free time. We are now floating somewhere near the Red Sea we have some of our Marines currently doing training in Djibouti, Africa and the other majority of our unit is remaining on ship just waiting for the call for anywhere in Africa or the Middle East. With the limited contact we have with the outside world the care packages you send the Marines has a huge impact on their morale and general demeanor. I cannot send pictures from ship otherwise I would, if you look up the 13th MEU on Facebook they routinely post photos and stories on us (anything with the headline or tag of Golf Co. is the guys who are getting your packages). It is truly amazing seeing the reaction on these Marines faces when they see all the love, care, and passion being sent their way from people that they don't even know. To know someone you've never met before cares about what you are doing and supports us the way you all do is amazing. On behalf of all the Marines who got your packages thank you so much

Liz Montgomery's Acceptance Speech

Welcome everyone and thank you for being here.

Thank you Sheila McClure from Alpha Sigma and Donna McAvoy from Beta Gamma for a beautiful installation.

I started with ESA as an Alpha Sigma member over 33 years ago. Marge Cunningham my mom pledged me. Mom I honor you for all your hard work in ESA over the years. As the last active Alpha Sigma member it only seemed fit for Sheila McClure to install me as State President, since I originally pledged with the Alpha Sigma Chapter. Mom is not able to be active due to health reasons. However I know she would have liked to be able to help Sheila up here this evening. I also asked Donna McAvoy to be an installing officer as she too had seen me grow up over the years in ESA, as well as knowing me as an Alpha Sigma Member.

I chartered a chapter a few years later, after getting married and moving to the Tempe area. I was very excited at that time about moving to a newly developed neighborhood and getting more people to join ESA. Well I did get a few and it was wonderful while it lasted, however approx. six years later I had to disband the chapter due to a divorce and other entities beyond my control.


