


Greetings from your Treasurer,

Proposed By-Law change Carolyn Vasko This will be voted on at State Convention

Chapters and Members of the Arizona Council,

Hello everyone. It has been a while since I have gotten to speak to you all at one time. However, I wanted to speak with you about something that I believe is in the best interest of our Council.

Last year, Bylaw change was submitted to the Council to combine the Parliamentarian and Jr. Past President positions. I was unable to be in attendance for that vote as I was the IC Rep to the New Mexico State Council that weekend. However, as I understand it the Bylaw was defeated because members of the Council I felt that we would be discouraging people from running for office. While I was disappointed, the Bylaw change failed, we did get lucky and people stepped up to run from the floor for the two positions nobody wanted originally.

If you have read your April Bulletin, you will know that we are 2 candidates' short for elections again this year. I believe with my whole heart that everyone cares about the good of the Council. I also believe that while there are people who might like to run, age and time constraint play a large role in why they don't. With that in mind, it is time for us to make a change in the number of offices we have on the Arizona Council Executive Board. With that in mind, I am formally submitting the exact Bylaw Change that was submitted last year to you again, to be voted on at State Convention.

I am in compliance with the 3 Oday rule as it is being distributed today, April 2 and our Convention is June 2-4, 2017. I would only ask that you recognize that we have not made a change in the number of officers since 2005, when we eliminated Third Vice President. It is not something we do lightly, but it is time.

ARTICLE IV ORGANIZATION

Section 3 Officers

Currently Reads:

The officers of the Arizona Council shall be President, First Vice-President/President Elect, Second Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer, Parliamentarian, and Junior Past President. These officers shall be installed during the convention.

Proposed change to read:

The officers of the Arizona Council shall be President, First Vice-President/President Elect, Second Vice-President, Recording Secretary, Corresponding Secretary, Treasurer and Junior Past President/Parliamentarian. These officers shall be installed during the convention.

Rationale:

It has become increasingly difficult to find members who wish to serve on the Executive Board. In recent past years it was necessary for the President to appoint someone to serve as the Parliamentarian. Having the Jr. Past President also serve has Parliamentarian is a logical choice, as they are aware of the business of the Council and has the experience to assist the Executive board with parliamentary procedure.

We have tried to keep the position of Parliamentarian and we voted this change down last year. Once again this year, we are in a position of having two offices to fill and no one stepping forward. This is not an unusual change as many other states have combined chairs on the Executive Board and it is time for the Arizona Council to make this simple change. Additionally, it is not the first time we have eliminated a position. In 2005 we eliminated the Third Vice President. People were nervous but it was the right thing to do for the Council. If the above change is approved, the following changes would also need to be made.

ARTICLE V DUTIES OF OFFICERS

Section 7 Parliamentarian

The Parliamentarian shall serve as Chairman of the Bylaws Committee and advise the President on questions pertaining to parliamentary procedure. He/She shall maintain and keep a permanent record of all Bylaw and Standing Rule changes. **Proposed change: Remove**

Rationale: There is no longer a Parliamentarian.

Section 8 Junior Past President

He/She shall be Disaster Fund Chairman.

Proposed change to read: Section 7 Junior Past President/Parliamentarian

He/She shall be Disaster Fund Chairman. He/She shall serve as Chairman of the Bylaws Committee and advise the President on questions pertaining to parliamentary procedure. He/She shall maintain and keep a permanent record of all Bylaw and Standing Rule changes.

Rationale:

Removing Section 7 requires Section 8 to become Section 7. Combining the office of Parliamentarian with the office of Jr. Past President requires to the duties of the offices to also be combined.

Removing Section 7 requires Section 8 to become Section 7. Combining the office of Parliamentarian with the office of Jr. Past President requires to the duties of the offices to also be combined.






