
Dear Sisters and Brothers of ESA:



Card makers:

- Scotch glue sticks (the best! -- Costco, or sometimes Amazon)
- Construction, Card stock
- New Greeting cards and note cards, stationery
- Envelopes of any size and color. We get a lot of pads of paper and we send those with 6-3/4 envelopes for them to use as stationery-buy by the box
- Used greeting cards that we can cut up
- Cash! \$17.35 per box for postage

Troops:

- Everything from a hotel room all condiments, tea bags, coffee toiletries, pad, pen. Some have little coffeepots with the tray and coffee bag. I pack the coffee bags in a baggy, throwing the little tray away.
- Pens, pencils
- Bobby pins, black hair ties, tampons, deodorant, tooth paste, toothbrushes
- Dial and Dove soap. Many of the other brands are too fragrant and affect the food that is in the mailing box, since they are together for about 3 weeks-even if packed in baggies.
- Foot powder
- Gold Bond powder (available in travel sizes)
- Q-TIPS-USED FOR HYGIENE AND CLEANING THEIR WEAPONS
- Sunscreen small tubes they can carry in a pocket are great
- Lip balm
- Combs, tweezers, nail files, emery boards, nail clippers
- Black and white ankle socks-men and women. Used in their shoes when doing exercises-no brand names visible
- Black, brown, or green heavy boot socks these are the only colors allowed with their uniforms
- Shoe insoles
- Sunflower seeds, 1.00 jars of spice, condiment packages from restaurants, breakfast bars, individual pkgs of crackers with cheese or peanut butter, Rice Krispie treats, jerky, individual pkg of nuts or peanuts, dried fruits (a great value is the small bags found at the end of the candy aisle at Walgreens for\$1.00)

- Hard candy (no chocolate-melts), gum, bubblegum, Twizzler licorice, bags of peppermints (often replaces brushing teeth)
- Cocoa, individual coffee tubes, cold drink tubes, teabags of all flavors
- Hand-held games, deck of cards, small sets of chess, checkers, or other games-large boards won't fit in the mailing box!
- Frisbees, squirt guns, baseball or softballs, yo-yos, hacky sacs
- All those pads, pens dream catchers, etc that come from charities



JUDE AND EASTER SEALS, BUT IN OUR COMMUNITIES, THROUGH THE MANY PHILANTHROPIC PROJECTS WE SUPPORT.

IT IS SAID THAT PEOPLE WILL NOT REMEMBER WHO YOU ARE OR HOW MUCH YOU HAVE, BUT HOW YOU TOUCHED THEIR LIVES. ESA ALLOWS YOU ENDLESS POSSIBILITIES TO LEAVE WONDERFUL IMPRINTS ON SOMEONES HEART.

LET ME SHARE A COUPLE STORIES WITH YOU. THEY TOUCHED MY HEART AND I KNOW WILL DO THE SAME FOR YOU.

A MOTHER AND HER TWO SMALL CHILDREN HAD ONE DAY A WEEK DESIGNATED AS THEIR DAY OF SERVICE. THEY CALLED IT "THANKFUL THURSDAY" AND ON THAT DAY, THEY WANTED TO GO OUT AND MAKE A POSITIVE CONTRIBUTION IN THEIR WORLD.ONE THURSDAY THE MOTHER WAS NOT SURE EXACTLY WHAT THEY WERE GOING TO DO, BUT THEY WENT DRIVING AROUND ON A BUSY ROAD LOOKING FOR SOME WAY TO HELP. AT ABOUT LUNCHTIME THE TWO LITTLE ONES WERE HUNGRY AND WASTED NO TIME IN TELLING THEIR MOTHER THEY WANTED MCDONALDS. THE MOTHER FINALLY RELENTED AND THEN IT CAME TO HER. THEY HAD PASSED SO MANY PEOPLE ASKING FOR FOOD THAT DAY, THEY WOULD HAVE LUNCH AT MCDONALDS AND BUY LUNCH FOR OTHERS AS WELL. SO ON THE WAY OUT FROM LUNCH, THE MOTHER BOUGHT 15 LUNCHES TO GIVE TO OTHERS.

THEY DROVE DOWN THE STREET AND AS THEY SAW PEOPLE WHO NEEDED FOOD, THEY STOPPED, GAVE THEM A SMALL AMOUNT OF MONEY AND SAID, BY THE WAY, HERE IS LUNCH. AS THEY DROVE AWAY, IT WAS WONDERFUL TO SEE THE SMILES ON THE FACES AS THEY SAW LUNCH FROM MCDONALDS.THEY WERE DOWN TO THEIR LAST LUNCH AND THEY GAVE IT TO A WOMAN STANDING ON THE CORNER. THE MOTHER GAVE THE WOMAN THE LUNCH AND RETURNED TO HER CAR BUT THE LIGHT TURNED RED AND THERE WAS NOT A WAY FOR THE FAMILY TO LEAVE THE SPOT. THE MOTHER DID NOT WANT THE WOMAN TO FEEL SHE HAD TO SAY ANYTHING TO THEM BUT THE WOMAN MADE HER WAY OVER TO THE CAR AND THE MOTHER ROLLED DOWN HER WINDOW IN TIME TO HEAR THE WOMAN SAY, NO ONE HAS EVER DONE ANYTHING LIKE THIS FOR ME BEFORE. THANK YOU SO MUCH.

THE MOTHER SMILED AND SAID YOU ARE WELCOME. SO WHEN DO YOU THINK YOU WILL EAT YOUR LUNCH? THE WOMAN SMILED AND SAID OH HONEY I'M NOT GOING TO EAT THIS LUNCH. YOU SEE I HAVE A SMALL DAUGHTER WHO LOVES MCDONALDS BUT I CAN'T AFFORD TO TAKE HER THERE AS I DON'T HAVE THE MONEY, BUT TONIGHT, SHE IS GOING TO HAVE MCDONALDS. A TEAR FORMED IN THE CORNERS OF THE MOTHER'S EYES AS SHE LEFT THAT SPOT, FOR IT WAS IN THAT MOMENT THAT SHE RECOGNIZED THE TRUTH OF MOTHER TERESA'S WORDS: "WE CANNOT DO GREAT THINGS – ONLY SMALL THINGS WITH GREAT LOVE."

ANOTHER STORY I RECENTLY CAME UPON WAS OF A FATHER AND DAUGHTER WHO SHARED A BIRTHDAY. TO CELEBRATE THEY DECIDED THAT DURING THE MONTH, THEY WOULD DO RANDOM ACTS OF KINDNESS IN THEIR COMMUNITY. THEY COMBINED THEIR AGES AND WENT ABOUT DOING 43 RANDOM ACTS OF KINDNESS FOR THEIR FELLOW MAN. THE LITTLE GIRL WROTE THANK YOU NOTES TO HER TEACHERS, THE DAD LEFT COINS ON THE STREET FOR PEOPLE TO FIND. THEY VOLUNTEERED AT THEIR LOCAL FOOD BANK, JUST TO NAME A FEW. NOT ONLY DID THEY GROW FROM THEIR EXPERIENCE, BUT IN A SMALL WAY, I WOULD LIKE TO THINK THAT THEY MADE A DIFFERENCE TO THE PERSON WHO RECEIVED THEIR GIFT.

IN HONOR OF OUR 75TH ANNIVERSARY, I AM GOING TO CHALLENGE EACH OF YOU TO COMPLETE 75 RANDOM ACTS OF KINDNESS THROUGHOUT THIS NEXT YEAR. IT CAN BE AS EASY AS HOLDING THE DOOR FOR SOMEONE, SMILING AND THANKING BY NAME THE PERSON THAT BAGS YOUR GROCERIES, WRITING A LETTER OF THANKS TO SOMEONE IN THE MILITARY OR DELIVERING MEALS TO THOSE WHO ARE UNABLE TO LEAVE THEIR HOMES.THESE THINGS MAY BE SMALL TO YOU, BUT CAN MEAN THE WORLD TO ANOTHER INDIVIDUAL - JUST LIKE THE MOTHER AND HER CHILDREN GOING TO MCDONALDS AND THE FATHER AND HIS DAUGHTER TEAMING UP MADE AN IMPACT ON THEIR COMMUNITIES.

KNOWING EACH OF YOU LIKE I DO, THIS WILL NOT BE A DIFFICULT CHALLENGE AT ALL. IN FUTURE BULLETIN ARTICLES AND AT THE SEPTEMBER COUNCIL MEETING, YOU WILL LEARN MORE ABOUT MY PLANS FOR YOUR ACTS OF KINDNESS SO BE SURE TO MAKE NOTE OF THEM OVER THE SUMMER.

HAVING GROWN UP WITH ESA IN MY LIFE, I KNEW WHAT THE ORGANIZATION OFFERED ITS MEMBERSHIP. BUT IT WASN'T UNTIL MY MOTHER ASKED IF I WOULD LIKE TO JOIN HER THAT I TRULY EXPERIENCED THE MANY BENEFITS ESA PROVIDED.


\$383,331.58 or 2,662.02 per member. That deserves some applause and patting ourselves on the back.






