This was posted on August 29, 2019 - You might have heard of Bitty and Beau's Coffee in North Carolina, also known as "The Happiest Place in Wilmington." It's the coffee shop founded by Amy Wright and her husband that is unique for its hiring policy: exclusively employing people with intellectual and developmental disabilities, such as Down syndrome, cerebral palsy, and autism. They have over 100 employees and managers working at Bitty & Beau's Coffee so it is hard to feature them all. They post a couple of crew members every couple of weeks on their website. What an inspirational story!
