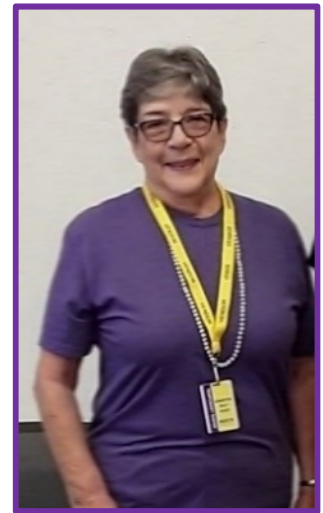
February - It's sweetheart month! Pay the price of your favorite chocolate bar; if you don't ...then each chocolate you eat pay \$.75 - un huh

Just letting you know that Easter Seals has submitted a project for the United Ways Days of Caring. They are going to be doing a lot of work at the ranch, Easter Seals Blake Foundation Camp Urbano. This year's Days of Caring will be Oct. 25th and 26th. <https://www.unitedwaytucson.org/daysofcaring> - search for Revitalize Camp Urbano. If you could help spread the word, we hope to get a lot of volunteers because we have a lot of work to build, paint, compost, and much more at the ranch. The horses, goats, chickens, etc...will love you for it



Aviva Children's Services was recently acquired under the Easter Seals umbrella. It has been in Tucson since 1978 and I just heard about it. They are a 501c3 non-profit to provide enhanced services to improve the quality of life for children who are victims of abuse, neglect, poverty and who reside in

Pima County. <https://avivatucson.org/about-aviva/>

They have a Community resources program to provide basic essentials like clothes and school items. They have also been asked to set up one in Cochise County and that is in the works.

They have a family court services program to help with child custody issues and provide child therapy. This side of the building is set up as a child's dream with a life size house for the kids to play in and a pirate's den which is the library and each room set up in a different child theme. They also have a parent support program.

We were asked by Easter Seals Blake Foundation to help sort and organize the donations they receive, which has overwhelmed the staff. So every Tuesday at 9am, I have set up volunteers to go over and sort. So far, Jackie Fahey, Penny Ofholter, Jeff, myself and Mary Jane Hickey have gone. Mary Jane then talked to one of her friends at Church who has recently lost her husband and her friend Jean is also going to work with her the next three weeks, while we are gone. That is what we are about, friendship. So far, she isn't joining ESA, but you knows? And Loralie is going when she returns from Colorado.

In addition, they have their own volunteer group, the Aviva Divas, who meet several times a week to make quilts, doll clothes, knitted items etc. for Christmas presents for the children and for several craft fairs where they sell things and the money is used to purchase Christmas toys. Last year, they raised \$7000.

Each child gets a quilt, a stuffed animal and 2 toys or other items each year. There are 3,000 to 5,000 kids in foster care in Pima County.
