Here are a few communities stories that I would like to share with all of you. Community awareness & helping others:

Tucson, Arizona family honors their late daughter by helping others. Rosaura Hernandez' life was cut short after her ex-boyfriend took her life on May 6, 2018.

Her parents, April and Joe Barbosa, created an organization called "Justice for Rosaura" to help those in domestic violence situations after their daughter was tragically lost in one.

A walk was held on February 15, 2020 to help raise awareness and that day would have been Rosaura's 20th birthday. This family set up this organization to help men and women affected by domestic violence. What started with their daughter has now turned into something the community can use as a resource. "We try to give that love back by raising awareness about anti-violence and by bringing services that our community needs to try to help people get better coping skills so they won't have to commit violence," said Barbosa. Safety, confidence and independence are what 'Justice for Rosaura' aims to give back to those in a domestic violence situation by offering support, education and mentorship. You can find more information on www.justice4rosaura.org. This is an amazing story of strength and courage by the Barbosa family.

More community awareness and helping others:

Addison Brown 6th grader and 11 year old girl from Lowell, Indiana are making a difference in kids all over the Midwest in January 2020. She makes what she calls "Smile Bags", these are drawstring bags packed with different items. These "Smile Bags" have been donated to different police department for squad cars. Then the bags are given to kids by the police when they are being taken away from their

parents and going into foster care. You can learn more about this project just visit www.milesofmanysmiles.wixsite.com/mysite. This incredible young lady, Addison Brown wanted to spread kindness to kids who are going through a hard time in their life.



Highland Police Commander John Banasiak said Addison Brown has donated 40 bags to the department that are filled with toys, books, tissues and other items to help children cope through traumatic events.

## International Council Dues Chapter State Other Councils

### How to Remain Non-Profit?

- All entities <u>MUST</u> pay IC Council dues. Entities are: Chapters, District Councils, Regional Councils, State Councils, and any other Zone or Auxiliary.
- All entities <u>MUST</u> submit a Tax-Form (Tax Facts) to Headquarters each year by September 15<sup>th</sup>.
- > All individual ESA members **MUST** pay individual member dues.

### If these three (3) items are NOT completed, then the entity is NOT considered Non-Profit

### What Do I Owe and Where Do I Send It?

- Individual Member dues are sent to ESA Headquarters. Each member will receive a bill in the mail. These are paid yearly during the month you pledged. Dues are \$49 (unless you are a senior or a Life-Active Member).
- IC Council dues are due at the beginning of the ESA Year (August 1<sup>st</sup>) and must be paid before May 1st to be considered in "good standing" and receive voting privileges at IC Convention. <u>These dues are mailed to the current IC Treasurer</u>. DO NOT SEND TO ESA HEADQUARTERS.



St Jude Children's Research Hospital scientists are studying the immune response to brain tumors and have identified a pathway that clears a toxic protein that is a hallmark of Alzheimer's disease. They found the pathway in microglial cells, the primary immune cells of the brain and central nervous system. How wonderful to know our hard work through fundraising helps this groundbreaking research.
