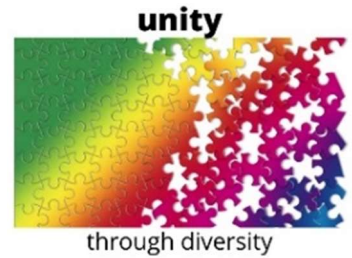

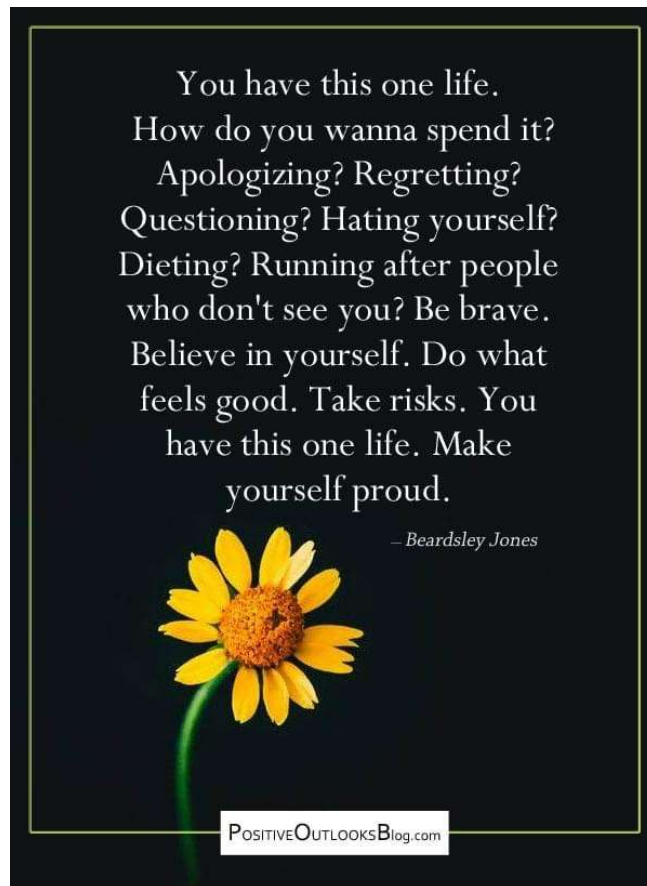
Greetings All,

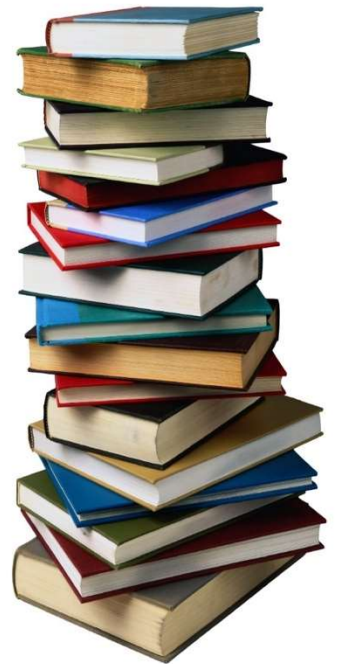

As a volunteer she can select where she wants to send her books which is pretty neat.

My 17 year old grandson, Jayson, has selected Operation Paperback for his Eagle Scout project.



His goal is to collect and ship 200 books. He will be utilizing 8 Scouts and 8 adults for his work force.

The Scouts will go door-to-door in a targeted neighborhood to place flyers and advertise the book drive and mobile pick-up service.

For fundraising he will collect bottles and pop cans for recycling.

He will be selecting community partners such as his local church and schools for donations and books.

He will be giving a lecture to the Scouts on stranger safety which will include dogs and a visible front door.

For Scout safety during packaging and shipping, he will provide a First Aid kit, hand dolie, work gloves and googles.

The work will be done outside to eliminate dust.

I will keep you posted on the outcome.

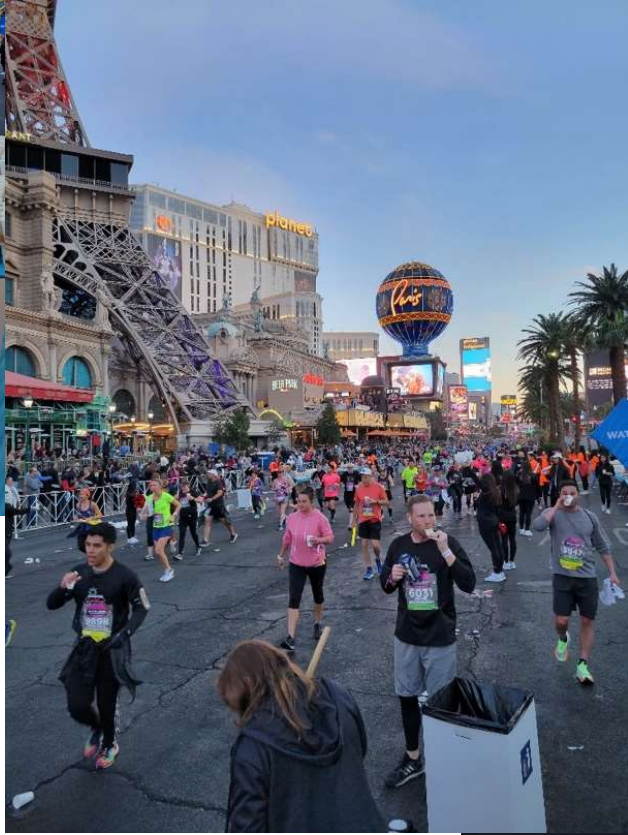
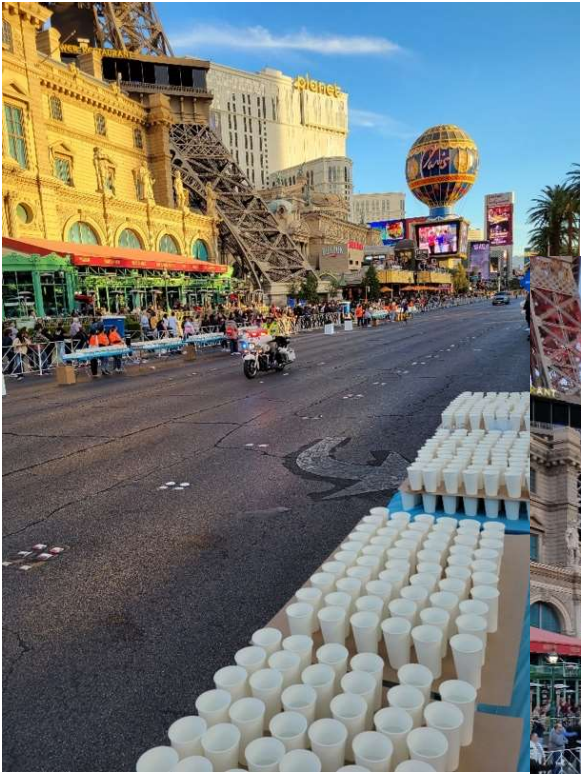
