What a difference a day or in this case a year can make.

I remember as a child attending state conventions (although I mainly hung out in the pool) with my parents and knowing that there were hundreds of people in attendance... move forward to the first time I stood before you and gave a speech after being installed... there were at least 80 people in that room....so as you can see Our numbers have been dropping for a while and that is something that has to change if we are going to survive but in order for that to happen we first need to ask ourselves Are we an organization that still serves a purpose ? I firmly believe the answer to that is YES. In 2020 we ranked in the top three state councils for total philanthropic hours with 22,311. And Last year even with COVID the Arizona council raised \$593,306 for St.Jude. You saw today at the awards luncheon what amazing work we do. So why aren't more people here???
