

President Deana Walters welcomed everyone and introduced the Executive board and special guest Lynda Edwards, I.C. Representative/ I.C. President. Patricia advised that there are bingo cards that have items related to the convention. There are prizes.

Roll call taken by Jenny Young, Secretary. Nine chapters were represented with a total count of 35 attendees.

Appointed Board Reports

Arizona Western States Representative- Donna Ort

Donna gave a history of the Western States Regional Council between 1996-2023 including the "Helping Hands" scholarships given via the ESA Foundation to various members/family of members using money raised in the Helping Hands walks. There have been 25 "Fling" events since 1996. Total attendance over the 25 flings is 1,488. The Helping Hands Walks raised \$49,815 and 56 people have been given a total of \$36,280. John Vitt may be the Arizona Representative in the future, this to be determined. Shari Stapleton-Smith advised that there may be a Fling in Southern Arizona. Phoenix had their inaugural Oasis of Hope and raised \$383,000. The 2024 Las Vegas Walk/Run is September 7th, and the Phoenix Walk/Run is September 28th. John thanked Eta Gamma for their continued hard work and dedication in raising so much money for St. Jude. The total raised for St Jude will be revealed this evening.



ESA Foundation- Kathy Riebock

The Foundation has had a good year despite all the changes last year and donated more as a State than last year! There was new Counsellor training held in August and November (which Terrie Rust participated in) and members helped to spread the word to various educational facilities about scholarship opportunities. Information regarding the Fantasy event and new Pathway Program was made available in the Bulletin and Alpha Chi chapter was recognized as the winning chapter for the most raised in the February/March Fantasy event. As a result of the fundraiser held at each Council meeting by Kathy there is a check in the amount of \$261.00 to the ESA Foundation as a donation from Arizona. There is an auction item heading to the I.C. Convention in July which Patricia Gale will deliver on Kathy's behalf, this is \$634 in value, all donated by members of ESA or from fundraising. In May, Alpha Chi held a fundraiser for nonprofit St Vincent De Paul and local Radio station Cool FM featured this and gave an opportunity to discuss not only the fundraising but ESA as a whole. She lost her hearing and wanted people to know that she is not ignoring people but may not be able to hear them, she needs to be able to read lips but can hear somewhat if you are close by. She has had some devastating losses in her life in the last few years. This was followed by another devastating loss of Brenda Meyers, I.C. President 2023-24. She has now been thrust into becoming President of the I.C. Board earlier than anticipated. She wishes to honor Brenda at the I.C. Convention and hopes that many members will be in attendance.

Brenda's theme was "Connecting in ESA"/The Power of Us and Lynda showed a short PowerPoint of examples of this over the last year. Lynda looks forward to making even more connections with members of this Council and hopes to see members in July 10-13th in Kansas. Lynda ended by showing us an app that you can get for phones that scribes everything that is said. The app is called "Livetranscribe" and can be used by anyone who is or is not hard of hearing.
