Terrie's Acceptance Speech

Any organization, in order to fulfill their mission, needs to set goals and head in the direction that will lead to accomplishing those goals. It is critical that the members of such an organization identify the "True North" of their heading and agree on the path to take.


My Presidential theme is Our ESA Compass. To understand what this represents, we need to first consider the purpose of a compass. Most everyone is familiar with a compass rose, the icon that points to the 4 cardinal directions: north, south, east, and west, each separated by 90 degrees, with north being 0 or 360 degrees, east at 90 degrees, south at 180 degrees, and west at 270 degrees.

But a compass does more than just point to these directions. A compass is a precision tool for navigation. It provides guidance as we find our way to or from a place. The security in knowing that we are able to find our way accurately is comforting and keeps us from the anxiety we can feel if floundering or getting lost. However, deviating from the course even slightly can take us to an unplanned location or even get us completely turned around!

Many people think that just one degree difference is a small, barely noticeable thing. But the truth is, there are huge ripple effects to changing course by just one degree. Here's an example of a plane flight...

Imagine an airplane leaving from Los Angeles flying direct to Rome, Italy. The flight will take about 12 hours if the plane goes in a direct and straight line.

But, if the nose of the airplane is pointed just 1 degree off course to the south, after 12 hours the plane will land somewhere in Tunisia, Africa! If there is a 1 degree difference to the north, the plane might land in Slovenia or Austria!



A tiny difference in direction has a huge effect in outcome over a long distance.

It's the same with us... just a small change in direction can have either a positive or negative impact on our lives, in our chapters, and on those around us.

Setting a new course can sometimes create confusion if a heading is not clearly in mind. Our personal lives are guided by core standards that we have learned or developed over the course of our lives. The same can be said about ESA standards, also known as core traditions, that we have learned and practiced, some of us over a period of decades! They provide a common bond between members and chapters. Many of these core standards keep us firmly rooted so we're not moving aimlessly. They also provide grounding so we can join together in a common experience.

Just like in the airplane analogy, your AZ ESA Executive Board, your chapters, and your members should be aiming for a precision course destination, whatever that course may be – but there should be one. It only takes one minor diversion for the course to head away from the intended destination. This is not to say that we all need to move in the same direction. What makes ESA unique is that as chapters, we can determine our own course.

To this end, I have created a new appointed position, that of a Compass Ambassador. The Ambassador's responsibility will be to seek out, identify, and acknowledge those chapters that accomplish taking their ESA chapter in a new direction. What this looks like will vary and can be something like creating social media promotions, establishing reciprocal community partnerships, or something entirely different. These chapters will be acknowledged at our State Council meetings with a Golden Compass Award.

As ESA members, and as individuals, we all should be looking for ways to move ourselves in new directions to keep from stagnation and to generate enthusiasm to engage. The following story helps illustrate this point.



Two people come to a mountain with a pot of gold on top, 5,000 feet up. The first is so lazy that, although he wants to get to the gold, he refuses to take an upward step. He walks around the base of the mountain, always staying at exactly the same elevation.

The second guy is pretty lazy too, so he too refuses to hike the steep trail to the top. In fact, he heads off on almost the same course as the first guy, except that he angles off just enough that with each step, he goes up half and inch -- about a 1-degree slope.

No matter how long the first guy walks, he'll always remain at the base of the mountain. The second guy has a long

road ahead of him, but after about 23 miles of hiking, he reaches the pot of gold.

The difference is one degree.

How many people live their lives walking around the base of the mountain, never getting anywhere? Everyone travels 24 hours every day, whether they're climbing or not. How much more could we accomplish if we'd make even "one-degree" of effort to improve something about ourselves or our chapter. It doesn't even have to be anything hard. You just have to do something, to pick something to do one degree better today, and then never stop doing it.

• How will you challenge yourself this year to make that "one degree" change?

- What goal will you set personally and as a chapter and what steps will you take to achieve that goal?
- What will you do this year to move your chapter in a new direction? How will such a move strengthen your chapter?
- What can you do this year to challenge and engage all your members?

As we focus this year on the theme of Our ESA Compass, we need to hold fast to those core traditions that keep us rooted in why ESA was founded, and how the overall goals of our organization impact our actions and outreach. Even so, as we move forward, consider how our compass can also lead us in new directions, guide us to establish new traditions, and point to new horizons we may never have thought possible.

It's time to pick a heading and set your compass.
